Antonio (Tony) Fundaro, a proud Italian family-man, died peacefully in his home in Dumont, NJ. He was 92 years young at the time of his death on June 11th, 2020, and passed while in the company of his wife and kids.

Tony was born and raised in Castellammare del Golfo, Sicily. After growing up as a blacksmith, he migrated to the USA by way of Montreal and became a US citizen shortly after marrying Santa Labozzetta of Brooklyn in 1954. He was a lifelong member of the IBEW Local 3 Union, an engaged member of the Knights of Columbus, and took great pride in sharing the bounty of his hard work with beloved family and neighbors. Tony never missed an opportunity to enjoy the little things in life. He'd spend hours tending to his garden, singing out of tune to Pavarotti, dancing with his wife, making wine with his family, shucking clams with his brother, singing lullabies to his grandkids... all of this while instilling a resilient work ethic in his children. His roots run deep in Dumont, and he will be missed dearly by his family.
