Eileen, 85, passed away at home, in her sleep and at peace, September 7, 2020.

Married to a wonderful cook, but one who could never match her meatballs and never tried (they were greatest on earth), she rolled her eyes at any time and in front of everybody; believed no one threw a better party, and always wanted to “be with the young people” at any celebration; she sang a birthday song no one had ever heard before and never explained where it came from; she loved her trips, and her friends at the bank, her “CC and Ginger” and her lava cake for dessert after a meal out. She knew how to laugh, and when to cry.

She told us what she thought, when we weren’t always ready to hear it; and loved us through our mistakes, when we didn’t know we were making them. She raised us by always being there, tried to give us strength, and showed us

how to endure.

She is survived by: her devoted son Robert; her loving daughter Doretta; her youngest son Tom and his wife Dianne; by her dear sister Loretta and her husband Manny; by her caring and wonderful grandchildren Bobby, Patrick, Jack and Tessa; also by her nephews and nieces who join us in sharing her memory, and in mourning her passing.
