After High School she worked for several companies including American Potash and Continental Shipping Co. ,she was also a member of her church Philoptochos and the Ladies of Penelope. She always believed in higher education and always aspired to attend college. While working she later attended Columbia University and finished her degree in English Literature in 1954. She continued to work as a para legal and lived with her widowed mother. In 1957 she was introduced, by her uncle to a Merchant Seaman and Chef from Andros Greece, Evangelos Glynos , she was married on Dec 8, 1957. After have her two children , they later moved to Tenafly to raise her children. After years of being a housewife, in 1982 she returned to work where she was the office manager and paralegal at Ampton Investments, in Manhattan until her retirement in 2009 . In 2020, she moved to an assisted living facility in Moorestown NJ, to have help and to be closer to family and her adoring grandchildren. Her greatest achievement was being with them , telling them how to always try to achieve more and never be
