Kimberly Rabeck Taylor passed away on September 1, 2025 after a long and hard-fought battle with cancer.

Born in Bergenfield, New Jersey on February 5, 1967 to Rudy and Anita Rabeck, Kim was the kind of daughter every parent hopes for: smart, kind, beautiful, generous and caring. She began her career at Settlement Funding Associates where her bosses immediately recognized her potential. Smart as a whip and a tireless worker, she quickly became one of the firm's most important sales people. No one was surprised when Kim ended up becoming a partner.

Though dedicated to her company and her clients, Kim managed to find time to take care of everyone she loved – family, friends, colleagues and the love of her life, John Zervanos. When her late mother's health began failing, she insisted her parents move into her Mantoloking shore house where she spared no expense in making sure her mother was comfortable.

One word often used to describe Kim is "rock" as in "she was my rock." No matter what was going on in her own life, she always put everyone else's needs ahead of her own. Though she suffered greatly from debilitating cancer treatments in the last two years of her life she refused to complain or feel sorry for herself. If you asked her how she felt she'd say "fine" and quickly ask how you were doing and if you needed anything.

In short, Kim was an extraordinary human being who improved the life of everyone who was lucky enough to have known her. Ask anyone who ever

met Kim and they will say the same thing: “She was the best person I have ever known.”

Kim is survived by her longtime life partner John Zervanos; her father Rudy Rabeck; her brother Darren Rabeck; her aunt and uncle, Elaine and Richard Bogert; her cousin Gina LaScola and Gina’s husband Scott; her aunt Camille Barrett, her cousin Arielle Barrett; and her aunt Rosemarie Lennon.

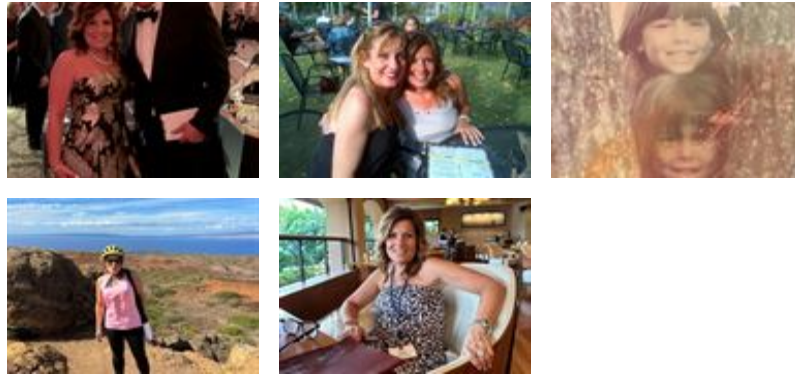
